Beef Cattle Check-Off to be

DELAYED TO 2018 \$5 per head effective September 1, 2017

The cattle industry in British Columbia is supporting the increase in check-off to \$5.00 per head.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE INCREASE IS DELAYED 2018.

This \$5 represents both provincial and national check-off amounts. The Canadian Beef Cattle Check-off is increasing to \$2.50 per head and at the same time, the provincial check-off is increasing to \$2.50. These increases have been made at the request of, and supported by the members of the B.C. cattle associations.

CANADIAN BEEF CATTLE CHECK-OFF \$2.50 (National)

The five-year Canada's National Beef Strategy recommended the increase to the national check-off, noting that the \$1 approved in 1999 just didn't go far enough in today's economy. The \$2.50 national check-off (non-refundable) is allocated by



each province and must meet the regulations that allow the check-off to be used to promote the marketing and production of beef cattle, beef and beef products and to conduct and promote research activities related to those products.

CIDC CHECK-OFF \$2.50 (Provincial)

The provincial check-off is increasing by 50¢ per head for \$2.50 provincial (refundable) check-off. This increase will be put to use by the provincial cattle associations for



projects that benefit the BC beef industry. The cattle herd numbers have continued to decline resulting in decreased check-off receipts. In consultation with the cattle industry in BC, CIDC felt it would benefit the beef industry in BC to increase the provincial check-off. http://www.cattlefund.net

Every \$1 paid in check-off in BC is matched by the Beef Cattle Industry Development Fund for investment into the cattle industry.


